What your Child needs to bring:

Your child should come in school uniform unless it is their PE day (see PE section for further information on this). There will be a hot dinner, jacket potato and a packed lunch option available but if your child would prefer a packed lunch from home, please send them in with this.

Children are encouraged to bring a water bottle into school so that they can keep hydrated and work even harder! Please ensure your child's bottle is named and that it contains water as outlined in our school policy.

In Year 6, resources and materials are still provided, however children are encouraged to bring in a pencil case containing a pencil, ruler, highlighters, pen, etc. if they choose to. If they do, they must ensure that they look after their own equipment as this is their responsibility!

PE:

During the Autumn term, Sharks will be swimming for the first half term then will participate in PE lessons after the October half term.

Due to this your child should come to school 'swim ready' on **Wednesdays**. Children should have their costumes on with their PE kit over the top. As a reminder, PE kit should be a plain white or house team coloured t shirt, dark shorts and trainers. There should be no big logos or emblems, and no football kits. Please ensure long hair is tied back and earrings are removed on these days. On colder days you may want your child to wear a warmer top and tracksuit bottom over the top.

Outdoor Learning:

We regularly make use of our fabulous grounds, so it would be good for your child to have wellies and waterproofs onsite so they are available for outdoor use, whatever the weather! Please ensure that these are named so we can find them if they become lost. Our sharks will specifically require suitable clothing for our forest school sessions on Tuesdays throughout the whole of the Autumn term.

Reading and Homework:

Children will receive a new reading book every week (we will try our best to update reading books as soon as children have finished them) which we encourage them to read at home daily (this can also include books from home and/or the library).

Their completed reading needs to be recorded in their blue reading record. We ask that children bring this to and from school daily as we will be encouraging independent reading wherever possible throughout the week. Children will continue to have the opportunity to share their book(s) during our ACE Book Share and children may be put forward to receive a reading prize!

In addition to this, children are expected to complete maths (times table) and spelling homework weekly. This will be collected in every Wednesday.

All children in the class also have access to TT Rockstars and Spelling Shed if they wish to participate in extra practice.
