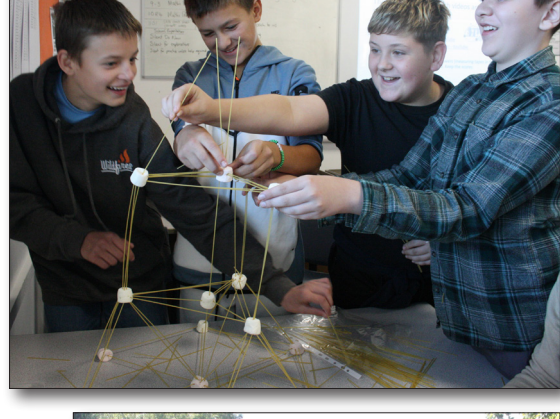
The event is key for raising funds for the school's charitable trust which supports a number of pupil centered projects throughout the school year.

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RHSC Pride

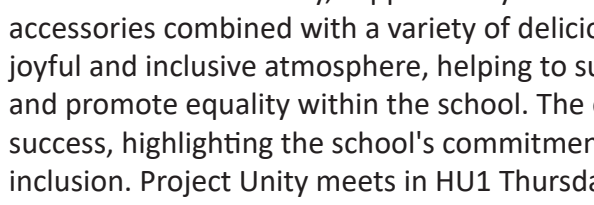
